The course consists of theoretical lectures, audiovisual demonstrations, and discussions on videos of spontaneous motor behavior from the preterm age to 20 weeks post-term. Individual trajectories and their predictive value for the diagnosis of neurological disorders will be observed. The objective of the basic course is to provide an introduction to Prechtl's General Movements Assessment. The goal of the advanced course is to learn detailed assessment systems. Participants will have the opportunity to present their own recordings. The course meets the specific standards of the GM Trust (http://general-movementstrust.info). Attendance during the 3 ½ days is mandatory. To receive the reliability certificate for the method, participants must complete a final evaluation on the last day of the course.


